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HOSPITAL DISCHARGE GRANTS FOR CARERS

The Hospital Discharge Grant for Carers scheme can help carers support the person who has been discharged from hospital.

Are you a carer?

If you are aged 18+ and look after, help or support an adult who wouldn't be able to manage everyday life without your help, and you're not employed to do it, then you are an unpaid carer.

- Does the cared for person live in Leicestershire or Leicester city?
- Have they been discharged from hospital in the last 2 weeks?
- Have you incurred any addition costs linked to their discharge from hospital? For example, cleaning, housework, carer's loss of income due to time off work

If 'YES', you may be entitled to a contribution towards the additional costs for carers when someone is discharged from hospital

Carers can apply within <u>2 weeks</u> of discharge from hospital by completing an online application form

EMPLOYEE FACTSHEET

FALLS MANAGEMENT

Care staff should:

- Be aware of each client's service plan and act accordingly if the plan contains special arrangements due to a history of falls
- Know how to check on people who are at risk of falling, particularly those who lack awareness of safety due to mental incapacity
- Be trained in the care service's falls management policies & procedures including the role of risk assessments
- Be trained in falls prevention and how to recognise potential slip, trip and fall hazards
- Recognise the complications of falls including moderate to serious injury resulting from the fall (cuts, sprains and broken bones, especially if weakened through illness, such as osteoporosis)
- Always remove any hazard that could cause a fall such as clearing up spillages immediately
- Be constantly vigilant of potential slip, trip or fall hazards and any noted should be reported immediately to a manager or supervisor
- Report any slip or trip hazards such as torn or frayed carpets, damaged linoleum or floor tiles, uneven flooring or steps, uneven paving, etc
- Ensure falls prevention equipment (including mats and sensors) are regularly checked to ensure they are working and in good condition and report any concerns
- Where bed rails medical beds, trolleys, bariatric beds, lateral turning devices or bed grab handles are used, ensure safety precautions are followed
- Make sure a bed rail risk assessment has been undertaken prior to use, the decision taken and the reasoning behind the decision documented and reviewed as appropriate
